 - o Legislative Session
 - Monitoring everyday
 - Lobbyist from Hathaway & Kunz is filling in until WLC can find a new full time lobbyist
 - Low key and low impact session for WLC
 - No scratch bill this year

- Dave Stevens is spearheading this and is prepared

Spring Retailer Forums

- In the planning and scheduling process
 - Keno Parties
 - Keno Visits
- Temporary Keno Manager (Mark Delphy) is back with us for a month
 - Making a positive difference
 - Still out on the road but due to weather, he hasn't been able to get out as much
- Working with Intralot
 - Trying to fill a vacant spot for an LSR in Natrona County
 - LSR wages are lower and filling the vacant spot has been a challenge. Jon Clontz will be speaking to the Intralot CEO regarding the low wage offer
 - Vlad (Intralot Manager for Wyoming) has been doing the installs in Natrona County
- Product Keno Manager
 - Great response with applications
 - Interviews are being conducted
 - Mark Delphy will be able to help with the transition and train the permanent employee

Board Retreat

- Planning committee is being put together
- Location for this retreat is being investigated
- Will meet with Chairman Willox and Vice chairwoman Monk regarding the agenda
 - We are being mindful of expense, location and timing

State Transfer

- Great transfer of over \$2 Million (Record transfer is \$2.8 Million)
 - Second highest transfer
 - o 3 major jackpots this fiscal year
 - High Cowboy Draw jackpot
 - Keno has helped with the transfer

o Capping the Jackpot on Powerball

- Will be up for discussion in the Director's Meeting
- Would like to ask the Wyoming players what they think
 - o Surveys
- Ask the Board their opinion
 - O Chairman Jim Willox's idea
 - Double the lower tier jackpots
 - Slow the growth of the biggest jackpot
 - Secretary Liebzeit's idea
 - Agreed with Chairman Willox's idea

- However, he believes it could impact player activity
- Would like to see the jackpots more reasonable
- Board Treasurer Gerry Marburger stated
 - If it is capped too low
 - Lose media attention
 - Could be designed to fail if that happens
- CEO Clontz
 - Could potentially anger players
 - Need to see what the players reactions are to overseas sales first
 - o MUSL will be notifying players about this change soon
- CEO Clontz will take the Board's advice to the Director's Meeting
- Building Purchase
 - Still looking for a building
 - o Market has slowed down for commercial real estate
 - Having issues with squatters in commercial real estate and rental properties
 - Looking at the old airport building
 - Cannot find anyone to give any information regarding this building as it is federally owned
 - Still putting money into the building fund
